Dear Friends of the Parish of White Waltham and Woodlands Park,

A few weeks into the new year, did you make new year commitments? Are you still committed to them? Do you admire commitment, these challenges that people do or the new skill practised, the body pushed to its limits through hours of exercises.

Maybe 'commitment' isn't a word that's very exciting. It doesn't grab the attention, nor shout of success or happiness. But it's something we need, and something that sometimes seems in short supply.

The voluntary sector reports reduced commitment from volunteers. Similarly, organised religion can find it difficult to get commitment from members. We are too busy, too distracted, sometimes possibly too focussed on the next good thing. However, we need commitment – as individuals, as community and as a society.

As I write, Christmas was less than 2 weeks ago. Christmas marks the shocking, extraordinary commitment of the loving Lord God to His creation. The Lord God did not give up and turn His back on this spoilt, sometimes dark creation marked by war and suffering. Instead, He came Himself, in the person of His Son Jesus Christ, to show us a better way, and to rescue us back to Him. Not because we are particularly lovely, but because He is ultimately loving. Commitment!

You won't be asked to share anything personal — it is a guided opportunity to spend some time discussing areas of your relationship such as money, holidays, romance, disagreements and forgiveness. And to refresh ourselves in our committed love for each other.

In this distracted, busy, self-involved world, let's seek to commit to others, even when it costs us. Let's be ready to receive the commitment of others. Let's learn more of what it is to receive the committed love of our Father God

You are also always very welcome to join us at any service on a Sunday at 10.30. We can help each other discover more of the committed love of our Father God.



White Waltham C of E Academy



.We have had a wonderful start to 2025 here at White Waltham C of E Academy. The children returned after their Christmas break ready for learning, and we kicked off the term with our immersion days for our new spring term topics.



Foundation enjoyed learning about Amelia Earhart. They learnt about how she was a brave pilot who attempted to be the first woman to fly around the world. She never wanted to give up and believed if you wanted to do something you should give it a go! They made their own paper aeroplanes and plotted Amelia's key life events on a timeline.

Year 1 and 2 had a very exciting start to term as they found a dragons egg! They built a safe, warm nest for it to hatch in and wrote the mummy dragon a letter letting her know how they were keeping it safe. They built egg box dragons in DT, learning how hinges work, and went on a hunt looking for invertebrates (there weren't many due to the cold temperatures).





Year 3 and 4 began their topic on the Victorians looking at the effects of the Industrial Revolution and how children were treated during the era. This was then reinforced on our trip to the Milestones Museum in Basingstoke on Thursday. The children learnt about the Tasker family and their ironworks factory. They then attended a Victorian school - there was a lot of giggling at the strict teacher!

Year 5 and 6 are learning all about America this term. They began by looking at the continent of North America and the natural features found within it such as Niagara Falls and the Grand Canyon. They then analysed the difference between the American and English national anthem. This ended with them performing the English national anthem on the recorder.



Tales from the Bells



If White Waltham Bell Ringing

It all seems a long time ago to say this. We, the White Waltham Bell Ringers, hope that you have a good Christmas and New Year.

We are now managing to ring all six bells at White Waltham, which has made such a big difference and a joyful sound. This is all down to the commitment our youngest ringer put into learning to ring his bell on his own. He did a lot of practice, then one evening it was the right time to see how he managed on his own, ringing his own bell. His aim was to be ringing for Christmas Morning Service with his dad. And he accomplished this!

As with all learners, there were times when he was not striking in the right place so to give him confidence, two of us rang alongside him so we could stop and help out. But with more practice, he gained more experience. As time progressed through December, our learner improved greatly so the Sunday service before Christmas, we had all 6 bells ringing and during the Candlelight Carol Service and Christmas morning we had 5 ringers. This was made possible by our young learner's progress and commitment – he is now gaining great Bell Control (which comes after learning Bell Handling). All our ringers were very proud of him.

For me as a teacher, I cannot put into words how it feels when someone who was a complete beginner is now able to ring on their own. It has been wonderful to have that teacher-student partnership, and I thank God that He has been working through that partnership. That is a great gift, a very small reflection of the much bigger gift that God gave us in his Son, Jesus Christ, on that first Christmas morning.

As one ringer learns, improves and grows in confidence, so the rest of the band continue to improve. This is helped by a ringer who belongs to another tower but joins us for practice. Their skills mean we are able to learn more and it frees me up to teach other ringers while we are practising.



A Personal True Story

A mite late but here's hoping you are all enjoying a very happy New Year. As I sit down to write, 2025 is only three days old!

I am in the middle of a series of events that started when I was very young, born in South London to a loving Dad and Mum. But none of us is perfect and my dad had a problem which rubbed off onto me.

Dad's job was as a civilian working for a Service electrical facility as a chargehand. During this work, Dad had to manage electrical trainees brought to UK from the West Indies. These men obviously had a different skin colour from Dad's and as I grew older, I realised Dad had some negative feelings for people whose colour and/or ethnicity differed from his.

When I was in High School, I did quite well in French and Maths. But as time went by, the Maths got more and more difficult, and I was struggling. One day I was visiting an uncle who lived close by; he had another visitor - an imposing man from what was then The Gold Coast; he had come to London to complete his medical qualifications, and his skin was a dark as anyone's I had ever seen!

A while later, this same man came to visit our home and I was busy trying to do my Maths homework. It was Calculus and I was struggling! As you may have guessed, this man from Africa offered to help and my thoughts at first were, "How on earth would a man like him know anything about advanced mathematics". But I kept that opinion to myself and just as well, for this man became a very firm friend as he helped me come to grips with two problems: calculus and my poor feelings for his skin colour. That day, God spoke to me and ever since, I have no issue with people who are "different" from me! The church I belong to here in New Zealand has a congregation of various skin colours and ethnicities and I love them all equally - praise God!

But my poor old dad? After he retired, he worked for a Christian book society selling Christian literature. Idi Amin was the then leader of Uganda and decided to expel all the people of Indian minority, giving them 90 days to leave the country. Many came to the UK and Dad was asked to make regular visits to one place where they had been given places to stay. You can imagine how my dad must have disliked having to help all these folk he would have thought of as inferior. God spoke again and so, in his early sixties, my dear old dad lost all his negative feelings and, I believe, was a tremendous help to these folk.

Why am I telling you this? I have very recently been back in touch with the wonderful man who God used to enable me to show love and kindness to all people regardless of their colour, language or ethnicity.

Thank God for His love and wisdom. He changed my dad's and my attitude to all people and, more importantly, He sent His Son to die all those years ago for all people, wherever on earth they came from or their appearance. As I write, my friend in UK and I are in touch, sharing great memories and hopefully, we'll be able to have video calls and catch up with what's been happening in our lives.

One thing is certain though and that is that because we both have accepted the Lord Jesus as our Saviour, we shall be together forever in heaven. So where will you be then???

Visited by night

'There was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, who came to Jesus by night saying Rabbi, we know you are a teacher who has come from God, no one could perform these miraculous signs you are doing if God were not with him.'

There is a need for some clarification here. Nicodemus's nocturnal visit to Jesus occurred because he did not wish to be seen approaching the controversial figure that Jesus was. The miracles he mentioned were something like a 'calling card'— evidence of Jesus' true identity. It is here that Jesus introduces the term 'born again' which puzzles Nicodemus:

'Surely a man cannot enter a second time into his mother's womb?' and it is necessary for Jesus to explain that entry into the Kingdom depends on being born of water and of the Spirit.

'You should not be surprised by me saying you must be born again. I have spoken to you of earthly things and you do not believe, how then will you believe if I speak of heavenly things. Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the desert (Numbers 21:9), so the Son of Man must be lifted up that everyone who believes in him shall have eternal life.

The most important news coming – and not what anyone wants – is the rise in council tax which will come in the Budget. This is mainly due to the increase in Adults' services, where the cost of residential care has risen due to a variety of factors. These include more adults, rising costs of utilities and rising costs for employers. Children's services have seen another huge increase with similar issues. And there is also the rising number of homeless people, who need to be housed.

Then we councillors hear of an historical accountancy error of some £25 million which was found at the end of last year. Councillors were amazed to hear this and, of course, this will hopefully be looked into.




