Dear Friends of the Parish of White Waltham and Woodlands Park,

I'm thinking about **dark and light**. As I write we are hoping for an Indian summer, but we are getting storm, rain and cloud cover... so much so that I have to turn on a light in my study in the middle of the day! As we come into autumn many of us are more prone to sadness, as there is less light and more dark in each of our days.

I also happen to have heard about the '**darkness**' in several people's lives recently; through our fostering experience, or through the lives of people I meet through ministry, or others I know of. Whether it is recent loss, relationship breakdown, or dealing with the effects of past pain and neglect, 'darkness' seems a good word to describe the effect on the soul of the person. You probably know something of it yourself: a gloom descending, everything a little harder, a little spoilt, a little bit more difficult to see clearly.

Why all this miserable introduction? Well, I am convinced that when we say **Jesus is the light of the world**, we mean that he has a very tangible impact. As we see and understand more of God in the person of the Son, then light can break into our lives. Hope into depression, peace into the troubled heart, value and acceptance for those who feel worthless, a settled attitude of joy through hard times, knowing a loving Father God who is with us and commits to us through all things. *(continued over)*



What is going to White Waltham Church really like?

What is going to our small village church really like?? What do you feel...? Fear? Uncomfortable? Will anyone talk to me? Well, I felt all of these & more when I first walked into White Waltham Church for the Harvest Festival Service in September 2019. I had lost my sister in April 2019, and the thought that coming to church would help me in any way didn't make sense. But a good friend of my sister had been a member of the congregation for several years & kindly invited me. After weeks of wondering if I should give it a go or not, I accepted & so on the morning of the Harvest Festival I found myself walking up the hill towards the church. I remember looking up at the tower & the feeling of should I just wait outside - or in the car; I continued to the church porch... I remember the sound when the door handle on that big wooden door was turned – it sounded so loud. The door opened & I walked inside.

Within seconds I was being warmly greeted by several church members, given a service sheet & invited to sit anywhere I liked. I sat near the back, unable to move filled with a fear of what was I doing, but within a heartbeat several people came over to chat to me and made me feel welcome.

The service moved me more than I ever thought possible, and I found that these people were ordinary people – I can't say I thought then that they could or would become my friends, but now they are so much more than friends; they are my second family – my church family. Yes, the support, friendship & fellowship within this church has turned out to be the thing that changed my life. I have been made to feel so welcome.

Now I have become a regular member of this special church and even help within the church in various ways. I can honestly say that coming to church has changed my life; I am no longer alone with my sadness & fears. Help is all around me in every corner of this church. Everyone has problems in life, but what this church family has shown me is hope, friendship, someone to talk to, support even to share a joke with or cry with in happiness & even in losing someone dear.

As I lost my last sister to cancer in November 2023 it was tough. But from the moment I told my friends in church that she hadn't much time left, I felt that I wasn't alone day or night. If I was upset or worried & felt I couldn't cope, someone was always around to text, call or meet up for a coffee & offer the support through the hardest times.

Now, 5 years after I first walked through the door, I am writing this hoping that my story will encourage others to walk into the church & feel the love & friendship I have been so fortunate to have found.

Do not be afraid to walk up the hill. Open that old church door and you will be amazed at the warm welcome, the friendship & support inside.

White Waltham CE Academy

We have had a fantastic start to our new academic year, CofE Academy with the children returning ready for an exciting year ahead.

We began the year with immersion days into our new topic. Foundation have been learning 'All About Me', getting to know each other and our school grounds. Year 1 & 2 have been immersing themselves into the world of the seaside, learning all about holidays in the Victorian era and then thinking about what a holiday in 100 years' time would look like. They had a great time taking part in a seaside workshop with 'History on a Page', the highlight being a Punch and Judy show.

Year 3 & 4 have begun their topic on 'Beneath the Surface'. In history, the children will be learning about the destruction of Pompeii in 79AD due to the eruption of Mount Vesuvius. They will plot the events of the eruption on a timeline and explore what can be learnt about the Roman way of life from the well-preserved ruins. The children will also learn about the Roman Invasion of Britain and the impact that the Romans had on Britain such as roads, aqueducts, and writing system. We also look forward to a trip to the Verulamium in St Albans.

Year 5 & 6 are learning about the 'World at War'. We have enjoyed a trip to Blenheim Palace to learn more about Winston Churchill, and will further our learning during our residential trip to Hooke Court. They will learn about the countries and leaders involved in both sides of the conflict and explore causes and consequences of World War 2. The children will also explore how life on the home front changed during the war, including the blitz, evacuation, rationing and digging for victory.

We have lots of other exciting events planned for the autumn term, including Jeans for Genes day, Macmillan coffee morning, our residential trip and our harvest service in St Mary's church.

We will be holding our open evening for new families on Tuesday 12th November at 6:30pm and would love the opportunity to show off our fantastic school. WHO MOVED THE STONE?'

This book title was first published in 1930 and was an attempt by Frank Morison, author and lawyer, to explain the mystery of who Jesus is. But how about other moving stones ? White Waltham Church has recently had its five -year inspection. Unsurprisingly, our new architect (a conservation expert) has highlighted some structural problems !

As the church can trace its oldest part to the 12th century, it is not a surprise that some stonework is very weathered; the lime mortar has fallen out of the masonry joints in other places and there is evidence of stone blocks made of clunch, that are flaking. There are also two stained glass windows that will need re-setting, some churchyard tombs that need to be repaired and two outside corners (quoins) that are gently pulling away from the from the adjoining walls.

We are drawing up a series of repairs to be done; the urgent jobs in one year, the less urgent ones in five years and then monitoring other works required:

- we need to deal with trees that are encroaching on the building;
- we need specialists to repair the pigeon inhabited belfry;
- we need to deal with the movement of the quoins;
- we need to repair the damaged monuments.

All of these tasks are costly so we are hoping to find some benefactors, specialising in ancient buildings, to assist us financially. But if you feel you'd like to help with a donation, please get in touch. Our church is in the conservation area of White Waltham, which means we need permissions from RBWM and the Diocese to carry out these repairs.

So 'Who moved the stone ?' Well in this case it is wear and tear over the centuries! But Frank Morison was intrigued about Jesus. He set out to prove, using many analytical and legal arguments, that the Bible accounts about Jesus were unscientific and could not be trusted.

As he pursued his theory, he came to realise that he was wrong! The Bible could be trusted and Jesus was indeed who he claimed to be, the Son of God. For Frank, the answer to 'Who moved the stone ?' became very clear. The resurrection of Jesus on Easter Sunday was miraculous – Jesus had taken the penalty of sin for the whole world, he had died and then overcome death! God had indeed moved the stone to let Jesus out of the tomb and to let the disciples in – they needed to see for themselves.

As we start to save up to pay for the stones that have moved at White Waltham Church and need to be repaired, let us remember God who moved the stone from in front of Jesus' tomb. Why not come and find out more on a Sunday morning in church?



The third and last of The volumes three Is locked from sight and God keepeth the key.


Yours sincerely, Flora. Aldershot 1900

If White Waltham Bell Ringing



As I write, we have just celebrated Heritage Open Day here at White Waltham Church. We had Church Teas, and the Church and the bell tower were open so people had the opportunity to come up the bell tower, see how bell ringing is done, and even have a go for themselves. It was a great afternoon!

If you would like to have a go at bellringing, do get in touch with us at St Mary's, White Waltham. We run occasional taster sessions for those interested in learning to ring. These sessions can be arranged at a mutually convenient time and day and you will be taught by an accredited ART teacher (Association of Ringing Teachers).

Church bells have been rung for centuries to celebrate weddings, coronations, and jubilees – and to call people to services. They are also rung for church festivals such as Christmas time, historical events and to ring in the start of a New Year at midnight!!

For those who are young and doing their Duke of Edinburgh award, you might like to consider ringing for the skill section. It's the ultimate heavy metal: church bells are the loudest* and heaviest musical instrument in the world. (**Ringing rooms are soundproofed for safe noise levels.*)

- It is for the young from 10+ years old and adults of all ages individuals, couples, and families.
- It's for all faiths and none.
- You don't need to be musical, mathematical, or strong.
- It provides a gentle workout and an easy way to make friends and be part of a team and a community.

Parking in Maidenhead

With the Nicholsons Car park in Maidenhead no longer available for the foreseeable future, you may like to park in Hines Meadow, Grove Road or West Street car parks. If you've joined



the <u>Resident Parking Discount Scheme</u>, you can get an hour's free parking each day in all three car parks. You can still apply to join, completely free. If you'd like to save money and don't mind a 10-minute walk into the town centre, the new <u>Vicus Way</u> car park at Stafferton Way is affordable and always has spaces available, also including plenty of Electric Vehicle chargers. Three hours parking for £3 is at least £1.50 cheaper than any town centre car park, with all-day long-stay parking just £6. Also at Vicus Way car park you can park at the weekend from 4pm on a Friday to 11pm on a Monday for £10 which is ideal if you have a planned visit for a weekend and take the train.


